On April 7, 1893 House Bill 42 was enacted, creating a museum for the territory of Arizona, now known as Arizona State Museum. George W. P. Hunt wrote the bill and later served as the first governor of the state of Arizona. Governor Hunt and his family donated objects that are now part of the ASM's permanent collections. Full Schedule
